

## Deprivation: Stokesley Deanery

The Index of Multiple Deprivation (IMD) is a way of telling how affluent or how deprived the area where you live is, compared to other areas of the country. The rankings below are based on the 2010 IMD, published by the Department for Communities and Local Government. They allow you to compare your parish to others in the Deanery, the Diocese and the whole country – it is a measure of relative deprivation. It's called the Index of Multiple Deprivation because it takes lots of factors into account: income, employment, health and disability, education, housing and services, crime, and living environment.

A low ranking indicates relative affluence whilst a high ranking indicates relative deprivation. A diocesan ranking of less than 115 means that your parish is in the least deprived quarter of the diocese; whilst a ranking of more than 345 means that your parish is in the most deprived quarter of the diocese. The data relates to the geographical parishes and so may not be representative of the people who actually attend church in each parish.
